Guidelines for authors :

- *The manuscripts are only submitted online through the website :* www.histoph.com *in a stan- dard Word format (Microsoft Word).*

- The pictures must have at least 300 dpi with a brief and specific legend.

- All the articles and reviews must have an abstract of less than 250 words.

- Each person listed as an author is expected to have participated in the study to a significant extent.
- Each author must submit a copyright transfer agreement to the journal.

- The references are listed in order of appearance in the manuscript. They must respect the samples references mentioned below (AMA style). They are eventually translated into English when the language is unusual. In books, the exact page number must be mentioned.
